

DIRECTORS STATEMENT

Who are we? Do our answers lie within our chromosomes? I believe DNA is just the beginning. With the explosion of genealogy testing, we have begun to answer one of human-kind's most long-standing questions accurately. We can trace our roots, heritage, language, and everything that existed before us as individuals. Rather than our chromosomes being the final answer to our story, our linked DNA serves as the foundation of who we are. So what happens next?

With Rooted, I wanted to explore the psychological side of DNA testing. While some may be apprehensive about taking the test, others can be fearful of facing the part of them they don't know. What happens when you find out that everything you knew about yourself, culture, history, and ethnicity was all wrong? Do you disregard the facts or accept an identity entirely foreign to you? What about cultural barriers like language, location, and acceptance? As popular as genealogy testing is today, the process of self-discovery can be a frightening thought. The results can be world shifting, complicated, and at the same time, incredibly meaningful. Facing these fears is where our stories begin. Our roots are the origin of our identities.




SEAN ADDO writer/director

Sean A. Addo is a Ghanaian-American filmmaker by way of Cincinnati, Ohio. While attending the University of Cincinnati, Sean juggled his passion for animation, motion graphics, and VFX while playing Division-1 football. He would eventually further his visual storytelling by gaining a Masters in Production degree from the University of Southern California School of Cinematic Arts. His thesis, entitled DEEPER THAN BLACK, has been celebrated globally for its honest exploration of identity and the "Third Culture Kid" syndrome.

Following his short film AMERIKAFO, Sean was deemed one of the top ten black filmmakers to watch in 2019 by Diversity in Cannes. Other notable awards are top rankings on Coverfly's Red list, a finalist for both Screencrafts Film Fund and Shore Scripts. Sean's blend of culture, history, and genre allows for a uniquely personal voice that resonates globally. His work wildly challenges the African narrative with a passion for bridging the gap between the diaspora and creating bold entertaining stories through dramatic thriller, horror, and historical epics. Sean's professional experience combined with learning alongside Clark Johnson and the late John Singleton has prepared him to direct his highly anticipated feature debut, THE HOMESICK.



Chrisman was a Film Independent, Project Involve Producing Fellow, and an Industry Academy Fellow with the Film Society of Lincoln Center and the Locarno Film Festival. She is currently a fellow in the Blackhouse Multicultural Producer's Fellowship, as well as the Deutche Bank Frize LA Fellowship. Most recently, she produced GROWING PAINS, which was commissioned by the Black Harvest Film Festival in honor of its 25th anniversary. Prior to that she produced SUITABLE, which has played at festivals such as Urbanworld and American Black Film Festival and was acquired by HBO. Ashley has a plethora of production experience, ranging from galas and live events to music videos, as well as digital and branded content. She is currently in pre-production for an upcoming televised comedy/variety special for the CW and developing one feature length project, THE HOMESICK, an international social thriller, along with three TV pilots, and two digital series. Chrisman resides in Los Angeles, where she also works at Women In Film, an organization that advocates for gender parity in the entertainment industry.



JAMARI PERRY producer









MATTHEW HALLA director of photography
